

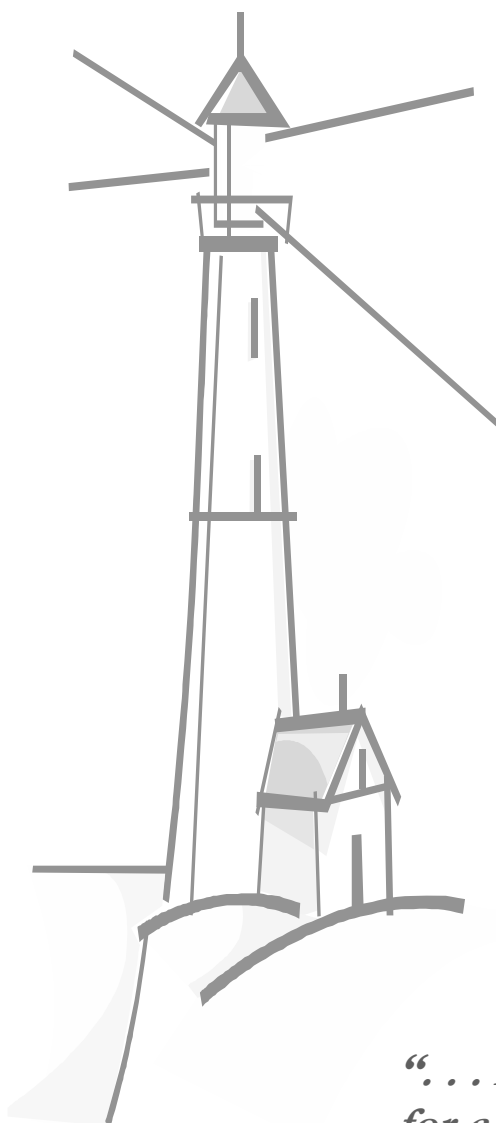

Newly Revised 2009 Annual Reports Available in the Foyer—

Due to a few corrections in the 2009 Annual Report, newly revised copies are now available at the table in the foyer. If you previously picked up a copy of the Annual Report, please be sure to get your newly revised copy, along with copies of the 2010 proposed budget and Treasurer's report.



The Board of Missions has several opportunities for the spring and summer in which church members can use their spiritual gifts. The board is developing several LIGHT teams for local outreach. Sunday school classes, small groups or individuals may consider how God could best use their gifts and talents in His service: The teams are:

1. Personal Care Items LIGHT Team: *This team will organize a drive to collect personal care items and then arrange to transport the items to a local shelter such as Bethesda Mission or the Interfaith Shelter.*

2. Habitat Harrisburg Mission Weekend LIGHT Team: *This team will develop a short-term local mission trip in coordination with Harrisburg Habitat for Humanity. The goal is outreach locally while training people in missions. Concept would include team building activities, devotions, and Habitat work in Harrisburg.*

3. Easter Meal and Gifts LIGHT Team: *This team will coordinate with a local prison and provide an Easter meal and gifts for the family of one or more prisoners with family in the Harrisburg area.*

4. Annual Toy Box or Gift Tree LIGHT Team: *This team will collect toys throughout the year for individuals listed on the tree. The team would contact local agencies for names of persons in need.*

5. Journey Café LIGHT Team: *This team will support the Journey Café with cookies, coffee or other assistance as the Journey Café starts its outreach in January.*

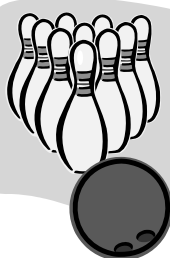
3R Student Ministries Event on January 31st—

CPR and AED (Automatic External Defibrillator) Training Offered—

You may have noticed the Automatic External Defibrillator (AED) located on the wall just outside the church offices. This device can be a life-saver in the event of a heart attack. While no special training is necessary for emergency use – just turn it on and it will tell you specifically what to do and when to do it – we have arranged training for those who would like to learn about it in advance of need, and learn cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) as well. The training will be held *Monday, January 25th*, 2:00 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. here at the church. There are a limited number of first-come-first-served spots available.
