

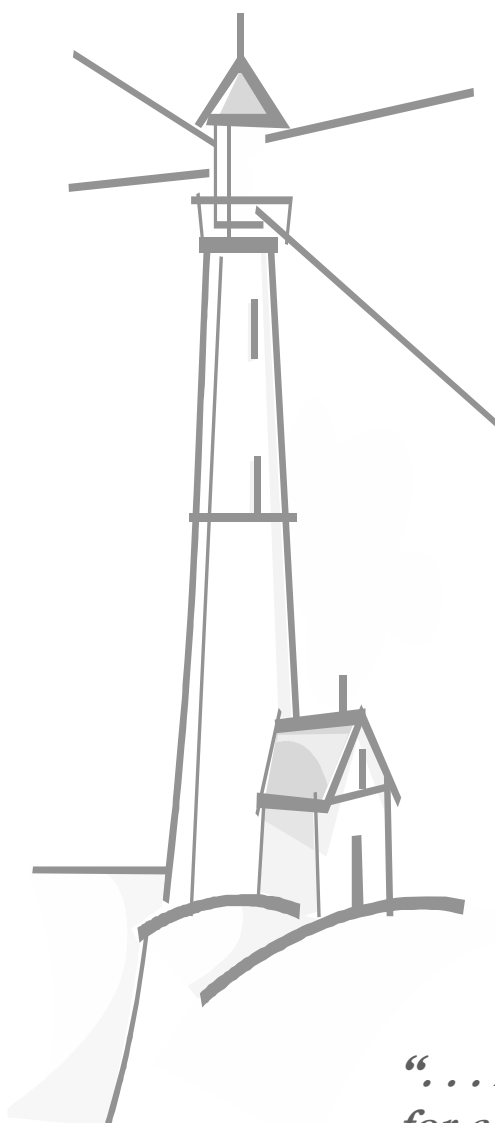

Board of Missions Opportunities—

Reflections on Today's Message

Our Sunday worship theme during January is "New Beginnings." One of the more dramatic examples of God at work to do a new thing happened late one night in Philippi. If you're struggling with certain hardships or heartaches today, there's a story of hope for you in Acts 16.

Singing at Midnight Acts 16:16-34

1. Circumstances may bring adversity, but I can _____ my _____.

"This girl followed Paul and the rest of us, shouting, 'These men are servants of the Most High God, who are telling you the way to be saved.' She kept this up for many days. Finally Paul became so troubled that he turned around and said to the spirit, 'In the name of Jesus Christ I command you to come out of her!' At that moment the spirit left her. When the owners of the slave girl realized that their hope of making money was gone, they sized Paul and Silas and dragged them into the marketplace to face the authorities" (Acts 16:16-19). "Why are you cast down, O my soul? Why so disturbed within me? Put your hope in God, for I will yet praise him, my Savior and my God" (Psalm 42:5).

2. Adversity may come, but I can have _____ and _____ in Christ.

"And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age" (Matthew 28:20b). "About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the other prisoners were listening to them" (Acts 16:25). "Suddenly there was such a violent earthquake that the foundations of the prison were shaken. At once all the prison doors flew open, and everybody's chains came loose" (Acts 16:26-27).

a. Our suffering finds meaning if it reminds us of the sufferings of _____.

"Whatever happens, conduct yourselves in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ. Then, whether I come and see you or only hear about you in my absence, I will know that you stand firm in one spirit, contending as one man for the faith of the gospel without being frightened in any way by those who oppose you. This is a sign to them that they will be destroyed, but that you will be saved--and that by God. For it has been granted to you on behalf of Christ not only to believe on him, but also to suffer for him, since you are going through the same struggle you saw I had, and now hear that I still have" (Philippians 1:27-30).

b. Our suffering finds meaning if it _____.

"The jailer brought them [Paul and Silas] into his house and set a meal before them; he was filled with joy because he had come to believe in God—he and his whole family" (Acts 16:34).

c. Our suffering finds meaning if it _____.

"And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose" (Romans 8:28).
