

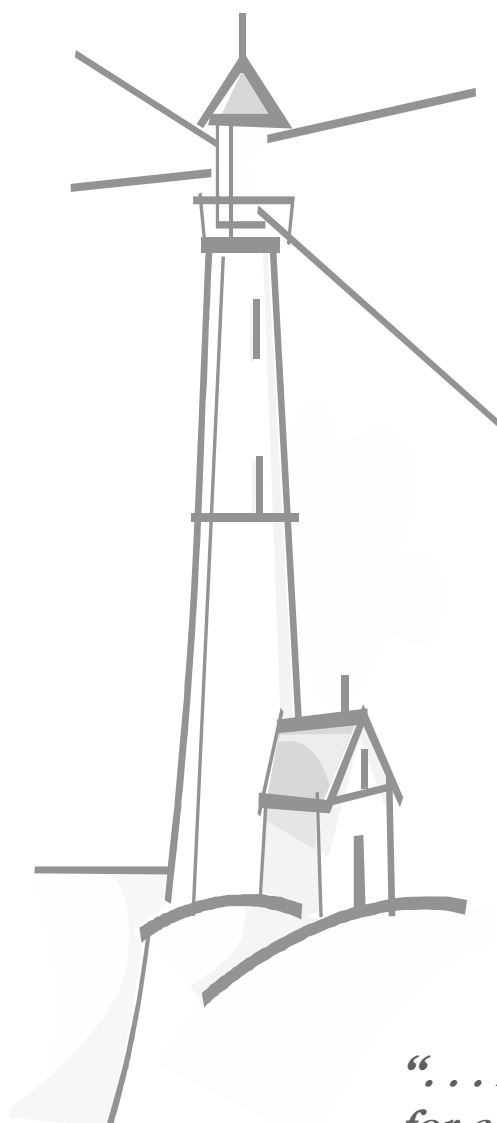

Reflections on Today's Message

This morning we're launching a new month-long Sunday series on the theme "Aspects of Love." During February our focus will be on growing in Christ-centered relationships. Today's message takes us to the very heart of who we are and what our Lord Jesus Christ has done for us.

No Greater Love Romans 5:1-11

1. I must realize the _____ of my _____ as the Lord sees it.

"You see, at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly. Very rarely will anyone die for a righteous man, though for a good man someone might possibly dare to die. But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Since we have now been justified by his blood, how much more shall we be saved from God's wrath through him! For if, when we were God's enemies, we were reconciled to him through the death of his Son, how much more, having been reconciled, shall we be saved through his life! Not only is this so, but we also rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation" (Romans 5:6-11).

"As for you, you were dead in your transgressions and sins. ... But because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in sin--it is by grace you have been saved" (Ephesians 2:1a, 4).

"But when the kindness and love of God our Savior appeared, he saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy" (Titus 3:4-5a).

2. I must realize the great _____ the Lord _____ to rescue me.

"This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us..." (1 John 3:16a).

"This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him" (1 John 4:10).

"Greater love has no one than this that he lay down his life for his friends" (John 15:13).

"But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8).

"As high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is His love for those who fear Him; as far as the east is from the west, so far has He removed our transgressions from us" (Psalm 103:11-12).

"I will forgive their wickedness and will remember their sins no more" (Jeremiah 31:34).

"I have swept away your offenses like a cloud, your sins like the morning mist" (Isaiah 44:22).

"Repent... and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out" (Acts 3:19).
