

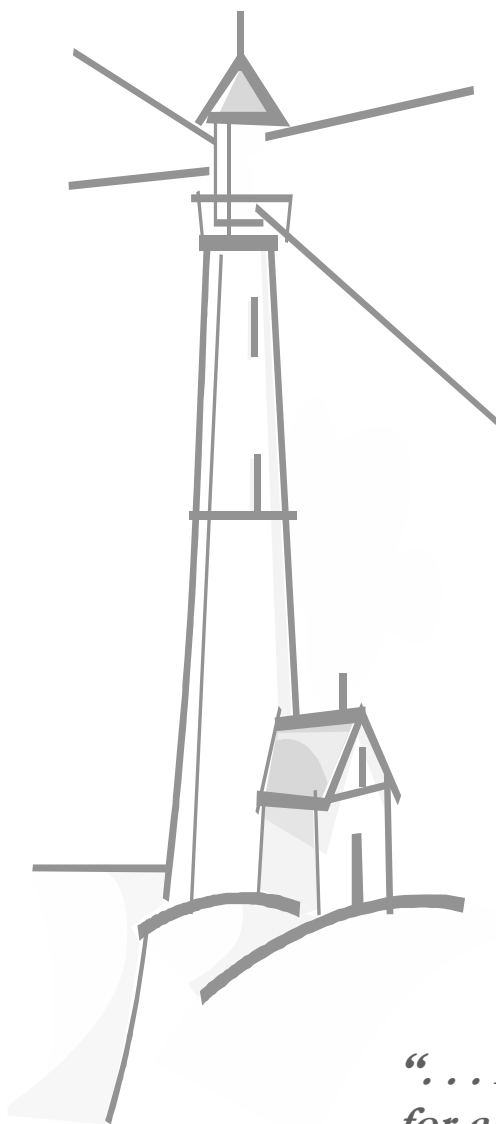

## Reflections on Today's Message

"Aspects of Love," our Sunday worship theme during February, focuses on how we can grow in Christ-centered, loving relationships. Question: How are things at your home? More specifically, if relevant for you, how are things going in your parent / child or your parent / teen relationship(s)? Today's Scripture reading reminds us that Jesus loves all people, especially the youngest among us. He calls us to do the same.

### Baby Love Mark 10:13-16

#### 1. Bless your \_\_\_\_\_ and be more \_\_\_\_\_ in your \_\_\_\_\_

*"O Lord, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth! You have set your glory above the heavens. From the lips of children and infants you have ordained praise because of your enemies, to silence the foe and the avenger" (Psalm 8:1-2).*

*"Sons are a heritage from the Lord, children a reward from Him. Like arrows in the hands of a warrior are sons born in one's youth. Blessed is the man whose quiver is full of them" (Psalm 127:3-5).*

*"People were bringing little children to Jesus to have him touch them, but the disciples rebuked them. When Jesus saw this, he was indignant. He said to them, 'Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. I tell you the truth; anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it.' And he took the children in his arms, put his hands on them and blessed them" (Mark 10:13-16).*

*"He called a little child and had him stand among them. And he said: 'I tell you the truth, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Therefore, whoever humbles himself like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven'" (Matthew 18:2-4).*

*"'And whoever welcomes a little child like this in my name welcomes me. But if anyone causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him to have a large millstone hung around his neck and to be drowned in the depths of the sea'" (Matthew 18:5-6).*

#### 2. Arm your youth with God's \_\_\_\_\_ and align yourself with God's \_\_\_\_\_

*"Do you hear what these children are saying?" they asked him. 'Yes,' replied Jesus, 'have you never read, "From the lips of children and infants you have ordained praise"?' (Matthew 21:16).*

*"From the lips of children and infants you have ordained praise because of your enemies, to silence the foe and the avenger" (Psalm 8:2).*

#### 3. Be aware of God's \_\_\_\_\_ and be \_\_\_\_\_ for God's \_\_\_\_\_ to you

*"For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well" (Psalm 139:13-14).*

*"I tell you the truth, he who believes has everlasting life" (John 6:47).*
