

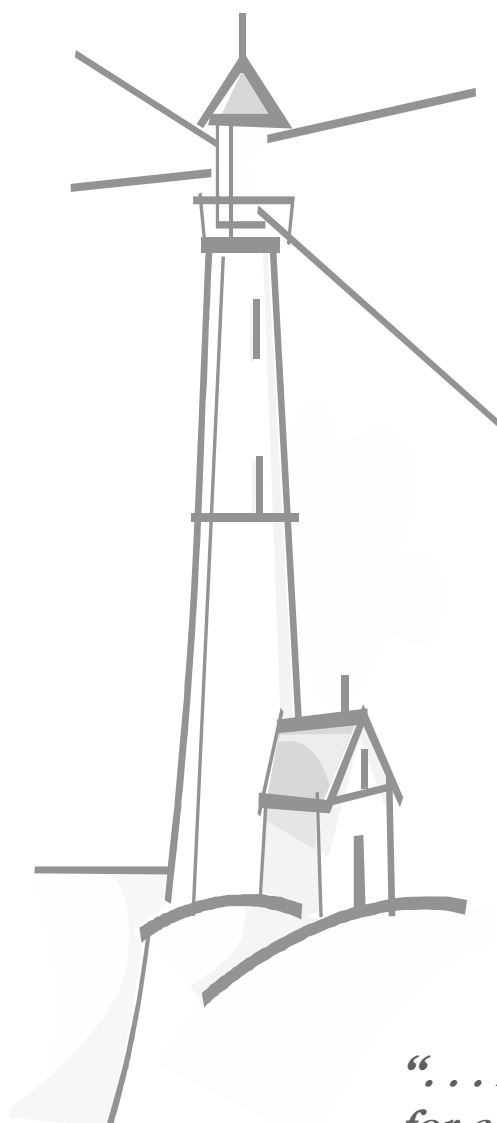

Contributions received to date through One Great Hour of Sharing for the Haiti earthquake relief and recovery effort total **\$4460**. Thank you for your caring response to those in need.

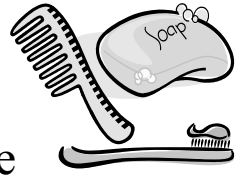

## Reflections on Today's Message

Our Sunday worship theme during February has focused on "Aspects of Love." We've considered how we can grow in Christ-centered, loving relationships. Today's Scripture reading and message simply beckon us to grow in our love for Christ.

### How's Your Love Life?

Mark 12:28-34

- 1. Love Him with all your \_\_\_\_\_.**  
*"People will be lovers of themselves, lovers of money, boastful, proud, abusive, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholy, without love, unforgiving, slanderous, without self-control, brutal, not lovers of the good, treacherous, rash, conceited, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God-- having a form of godliness but denying its power. Have nothing to do with them" (2 Timothy 3:2-5).*  
*"Here I am! I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in and eat with him, and he with me" (Revelation 3:20).*
- 2. Love Him with all your \_\_\_\_\_.**  
*"My soul will boast in the Lord; let the afflicted hear and rejoice. Glorify the Lord with me; let us exalt his name together" (Psalm 34:2-3).*  
*"Yet I hold this against you: You have forsaken your first love" (Revelation 2:4).*
- 3. Love Him with all your \_\_\_\_\_.**  
*"The law of the Lord is perfect, reviving the soul. The statutes of the Lord are trustworthy, making wise the simple. The precepts of the Lord are right, giving joy to the heart. The commands of the Lord are radiant, giving light to the eyes. They are more precious than gold, than much pure gold; they are sweeter than honey, than honey from the comb" (Psalm 19:7-8, 10).*  
*"Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will" (Romans 12:2).*
- 4. Love Him with all your \_\_\_\_\_.**  
*"If you love me, you will obey what I command." (John 14:15).*
