

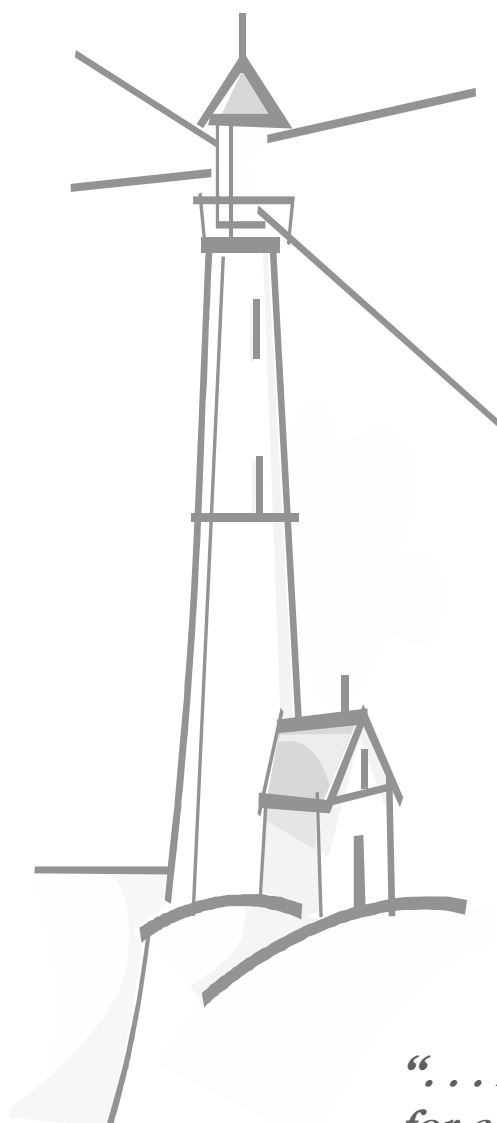

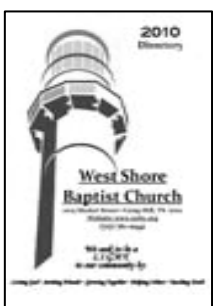

The next meeting of the WSBC Crafters' Group will be held on Wednesday, March 17<sup>th</sup>. Watch for details to come.



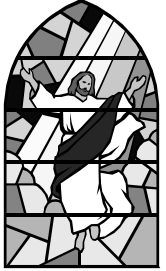
### **American Baptist Men's Breakfast on Saturday, March 20<sup>th</sup>—**

1. I am saved by \_\_\_\_\_ through \_\_\_\_\_.

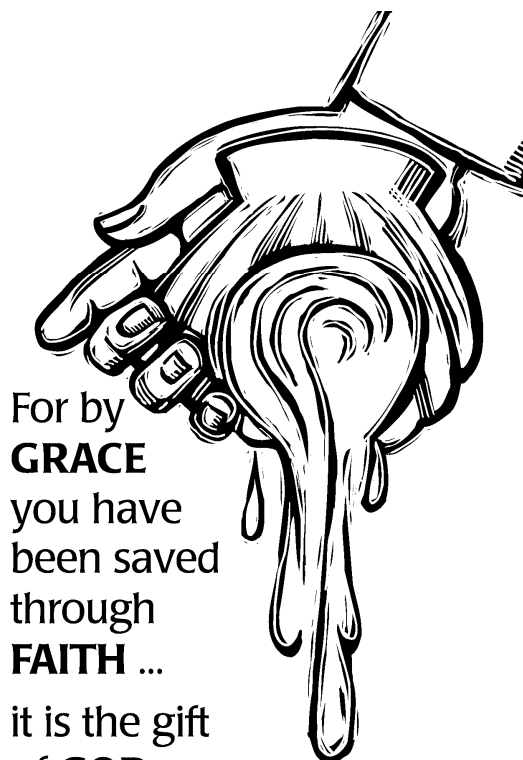
