

## From the Christian Education Board





This October 31<sup>st</sup> will mark the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Protestant Reformation. In the year 1517, sparked by Luther's Ninety-five Theses, a widespread theological reform began. As Christians, and especially as Baptists who fall under the 'Protestant' category, it is important for us to begin to understand some of the basic theological themes of the reformation. The five *Solas* (sola is Latin for "alone") characterize well the primary emphases of this theological reform. Allow me to briefly summarize these five doctrines and highlight some key differences with the Catholic Church.

- 1. <u>Sola Scriptura</u>, "Scripture Alone." The Bible alone is the ultimate authority concerning everything on which it speaks. The Bible must be the metric by which we as Christians measure everything. This differs from the Catholic Church in that the Catholic Church holds to a trifold authority structure that places the Magisterium (the church's teaching authority) and tradition, in addition to Scripture, in the place of ultimate authority.
- 2. <u>Sola Gratia</u>, "Grace Alone." Protestants argued that justification is brought about by the means of only God's grace. The sinner does nothing to deserve God's favor.
- 3. <u>Sola Fide</u>, "Faith Alone." Sinners are justified (counted as righteous) only by faith in Christ, not by the works of the law. This differs from the teachings of the Catholic Church in that the Catholic Church views baptism, not faith, as the instrumental cause of justification.
- 4. <u>Solus Christus</u>, "In Christ Alone." Salvation is found in Jesus Christ alone. Christ's substitutionary death atoned perfectly for sinners. If Christ has not been preached, the gospel has not been preached.
- 5. <u>Soli Deo Gloria</u>, "For the Glory of God Alone." The chief end of all of this is the glory and praise of God. Salvation is a gift from God and it has been accomplished by God for His own glory.

These five essential doctrines are at the heart of the Protestant Reformation. However, many "Protestants," today, seem to have forgotten what they are protesting. These doctrines are not dry, boring concepts that ancient theologians argued over; they are the life-blood of every Christian breathing, whether they know it or not. They are age-old truths, ever new. They are rock-solid, life-giving constructs that rejuvenate and inspire the Christian spirit.

We would do well, here at West Shore Baptist Church, to immovably ground ourselves in these ancient biblical claims. A constant striving for the "new" and "improved," when it comes to theology, is a surefire way to end up in serious error. Rather, a humble submission to the old, yet God-breathed, Scripture and its unchanging, unrelenting truths is what will lead a Christian into maturity. In this case, "new" is never improved! Will you join me in abandoning the new and pursuing the old?
