FROM THE PASTOR



ur new series of expositional sermons will be focused on 1 Peter, "LIVING A GODLY LIFE IN AN UNGODLY WORLD." America has become secular. It has become a "pagan" culture just like in the days of Rome. We can honestly say that we don't live in a *post-Christian* world, but we now live in a *pre-Christian* culture. That is how it was when the church began. Yes, we know there are many believers in America, but the culture around us has become pagan.

How are we to reach them? First, we must remember that they are searching for meaning and purpose in life, just as we were. Peter said, "He has given us new birth into a living hope." Second, we know that people are looking for a group where there is honesty, acceptance, and unity. Acts 2:42-47 refers to the church with a great sense of unity, "And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved." The Holy Spirit will not work in a church where there is not that sense of unity. That is an absolute basis for God working and moving in a congregation. We do have a ways to go in developing that spirit among us.

Another basic ingredient is a compassion and willingness to reach out beyond our comfort zone and look for opportunities to share our faith without pushing ourselves on others. No one can refute your testimony. Remember the definition I gave: "Witnessing is sharing Jesus Christ in the power of the Holy and leaving the result to God." Jesus said, "And you shall be my witnesses."



I do sense that there is a stirring of the Spirit among us that will lead to a new beginning for West Shore Baptist Church. A lady in a Midwestern town invited her neighbor many times to attend her church which was close by, only to be turned down many times. One night that church caught on fire, which brought the neighbor out to watch. The church member saw her watching and said, "I didn't think you were interested in church." The neighbor responded, "*I have never seen a church on fire before*."

<u>A Message From the Diaconate</u>

Loves GOD with all your \bigcirc

Loving God with your whole heart is the key to everything in life, because your relationship with

God affects everything and everyone in your life. It is impossible to love God too much, however, it is easy to fall short of loving Him with your whole heart.

In a moment of honesty with myself and with the Lord, I asked, "Lord, how can I love you more?" Instantly the Lord responded, "Be thankful." With those two words several Scriptures came to mind and concepts that I had not thought of before: God says in everything give thanks, for this is His will for you in Christ Jesus. Right now you may be saying, "I can't be thankful for the terrible tragedy or wrong that happened to me." You may even be in a current situation that is very painful, but your choice in every situation is to either be angry with God or be thankful. Sometimes we say we love God, but we admit that we are angry with someone who hurt us. If we say, "I love God", and do not love our brother, then we lie—for he who does not love his brother who he has seen, cannot love God who he has not seen. (1John 4:20). If you will decide to be thankful for the situation, recognizing that it is God's will for you, then the hate and anger will be replaced with love—even for the people who have hurt you. Love always brings revelation, allowing us to see things and people in God's light.

Here are a small list of Bible verses to help us give thanks to God always in all things:

- 1) **1 Thessalonians 5:16,** "...give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus."
- 2) Psalm 107:1, "Oh, give thanks to the Lord, for He is good; his steadfast love endures forever."
- 3) Ephesians 5:20, "... always giving thanks to God the Father for everything, in the name of our Lord, Jesus Christ."
- 4) Colossians 3:15-17, "Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, since as members of one body you were called to peace. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom, and as you sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs with gratitude in your hearts to God. And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him."
- 5) James 1:17, "Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows."

Here are eight more verses to look up for praising and giving thanks to our Lord and Savior:

Philippians 4:6, 2 Corinthians 9:15, Psalm 106:1, Psalm 105:1, Colossians 4:2, Psalm 118:1-18, Psalm 20:4, Psalm 30:12.

Right now I ask the Lord how I can experience more love for Him, and to reveal anything in my life that I am not thankful for—anything that is blocking my heart's flow of love to Him more.

"Be filled with the Spirit. Speak to one another with Psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs. Sing and make music in your heart to the Lord, always giving thanks to God, the Father, for everything, in the name of our Lord, Jesus Christ." **Ephesians 5:18-20**

"In everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for us." 1 Thessalonians 5:18


Church Leadership Strategic Planning

<u>From the Associate Pastor</u>





Thanksgiving has always been a strange event for me to understand. Families gather together, eat turkey, fellowship, and celebrate what they are thankful for. And yet, rarely does the question arise, "to *whom*

are we thankful?" Who is this great, omnipotent Being who has so lavished upon us His generosity and grace? Often, we get so caught up in the celebration of "thanksgiving" that we forget to actually give thanks. Aside from the prayer (which often simply serves as a short Segway into the real event, the meal) and possibly a little awkward group sharing about what we're thankful for, Thanksgiving appears to be less about giving thanks and more about getting full. It seems that a holiday of which the main point is being thankful to our loving God would be marked by serious prayer, reflection on God's character and generosity, deliberate celebration of His goodness, repentance from sin, and an attitude of generosity toward others. God's good gifts were not

intended to terminate upon themselves, but rather, point us to a higher and greater gift—God Himself. Turkey and pie don't exist just to taste good and fill our bellies, they point us toward the creative God who thought up the idea of taste buds, who allows us to enjoy the process of eating, and who ordained that humankind would rule over the earth and subdue it. Turkey and pie are intended to lead to worship. Fellowship with family isn't good simply because it's nice to get together again; fellowship points us to our God who has existed in the infinitely joyous fellowship of the Trinity for all of eternity. Every good gift is from God and is intended to direct us back to God in worship. Let us pray that God would grant us an increasing awareness of His splendid glory by means of the good gifts within our day to day lives.


