<u>A Message From the Associate Pastor</u>

The Word of God

"With over 100 million copies of the Bible sold each year, and with the full Bible being translated into 670 different languages, it is easily the most popular book of all time."

"Christian, listen closely, we must read our Bibles. Read them carefully. Read them with longevity. Read them joyfully. Read them intently."

"Visit many good books, but live in the Bible." C.H. Spurgeon

The Bible is a remarkable book. It contains writings that span across thousands of years, written in three languages by over 40 different authors with incredibly diverse cultural backgrounds. It contains poetry, songs, narrative, prophecy, proverbs, law, epistles, and apocalyptic literature. It is also amazingly popular. With over 100 million copies of the Bible sold each year, and with the full Bible being translated into 670 different languages, it is easily the most popular book of all time. And yet, for the Christian, those who read the Bible and believe it, the Bible is so much more. Far from simply being a historical document, for the Christian, the words in the Bible are the very words of God. In 2 Timothy, Paul calls all Scripture "God-breathed" or "breathed out by God." Meaning, quite simply, that the writings of the Bible are not *merely* human writings, though they are that as well. The writings of the Bible are also divinely spoken words. They are divine words, written by human authors in such a way that God's words are perfectly preserved and the human author's personality and cultural background are left intact and unimpeded. The Bible, for us as Christians, is a miracle. Within it we find the very words of God, the Creator of the universe. We proclaim this truth from the pulpit, we teach this truth in Sunday School, we sing about it in our songs, and yet, it is often puzzling to me how inconsistently I live by it. I cannot help but wonder, if I really believe the Bible is the Word of God, why don't I read it more? Why don't I consult the Bible during meetings when a decision is to be made? Why do I sit around waiting for a sign from the Lord when he has already definitively spoken? The Bible is a miraculous, wonderful book filled to the brim with truth that satisfies. Christian, listen closely, we must read our Bibles. Read them carefully. Read them with longevity. Read them joyfully. Read them intently. Don't just give your Bible a small part of your day before you run off to do what you really want to do. Let yourself swim in the ocean of goodness found in the God-breathed Scriptures. Make the Scriptures the center of your day; the highlight of it. My prayer for West Shore Baptist Church is that we would become a people of The Book. That we would love our Bibles because we love God. Christian, do you want to hear from God? Then read your Bible. Do you want to hear an audible voice from God? Then read your Bible out loud. Either way, read your Bibles and read them well. It is in the Word of God that life is found.

Pastor Paul By Deacon Russ Miller

Let me begin by saying I hope your 2018 is off to a healthy and prosperous start. As of this writing, West Shore Baptist Church is still searching for a new Senior Pastor. When Pastor Gary Bruland announced he would be retiring in June 2017, I for one was stunned. I

thought he was a terrific pastor and knew he would be missed. Judging by the outpouring of affection at his retirement luncheon, the WSBC congregation felt the same way.

Our Pastoral Search Committee was tasked with the job of finding Pastor Gary's permanent replacement. My understanding is that a number of candidates have been interviewed, but the committee is correctly taking as much time as necessary to find the right person. I am confident they will select an excellent candidate, but until then WSBC has been incredibly blessed to get acquainted with and benefit from our current interim pastor, Dr. Paul Thompson.

Pastor Thompson in my opinion has been amazing. He is older than most of us, younger than some of us, and relates to all of us. Both his personality and passion for the gospel are infectious. Listening to one of his sermons, you will invariably find yourself chuckling one minute and having serious reflections on his message the next. Replay one of his sermons that are on the WSBC website and see if that is not the case. I overheard a comment after a recent service where a member of the congregation said "He grows on you." Simple, but well put.

But aside from his sermons, I have been even more impressed with how he and his wife Sue, from Day One, have gotten involved with WSBC. He is doing a whole lot more than preaching excellent sermons each week. It started with just mingling and shaking hands with early arrivers prior to the service. Then he had us wear name tags. Finally for the summer months he, along with Associate Pastor Greg, instituted a combined service between the LifeHouse service and traditional service members. The goal was to get all of us to get to know and interact with each other. Pastor Paul makes that commute from Lancaster at least four days a week to either make him available in his office or to pick up where Pastor Gary left off with visitation. I can vouch for receiving sound advice from him during his office hours.

Pastor Thompson attends our monthly Diaconate meeting and contributes with both his knowledge and leadership. He realizes change at WSBC is both necessary and inevitable. He is helping to enact changes that will not occur at WSBC until long after the new pastor has arrived. Suffice to say he doesn't have to be that involved. But he is because he cares. He is giving us quite a "bang for our buck".

WSBC sponsored a Thanksgiving potluck outreach dinner open to everyone. We had an impressive turnout and all who attended were treated to a wonderful meal and terrific fellowship. Perhaps WSBC will attract some new members? At the very least we hope to make local people aware of WSBC. Positive outcomes or not, it was still a more than worthy effort by WSBC to reach out to our community. I do not believe this event would have taken place without the efforts of Pastor Thompson. This is another example of him going above and beyond what is required of him.

I would be remiss if I did not extend kudos to Pastor Greg. I don't think he expected to be our only non -interim pastor when he was hired. Out of necessity, he has been asked to do much more and he has responded admirably. In addition to organizing numerous opportunities for our youth, he has preached a number of sermons in both the LifeHouse and traditional services. He preaches with a different style but similar passion as does Pastor Thompson and the excellent rapport they have with each other is apparent. Personally I think they are learning a lot from each other.

We don't know how long Pastor Thompson will be with us, but in the meantime if you feel as I do – and I think you do – please give him a heartfelt thank you and praise God for sending him to us. He has been a gift. So thank you Pastor Paul. Thank you Pastor Greg. And God bless our new Senior Pastor leading us through 2018 and beyond.
