From the Desk of Pastor Kelly

It happens like clockwork. Each October (sometimes November for the more type-B among us) all of my pastoral colleagues ask one another the exact same question: "What are you preaching on for Advent?" We want to know each other's scripture passages, themes and titles. It is genuinely the only time of year that we get this nosey.

The reason for this fact-finding mission is extremely straightforward. The birth of Christ is recorded for us in 5 chapters of the entire Bible. Five. This is my 17th Advent as a preacher. 17 years telling the same Story, from at least 5 angles each year. That adds up to 85 sermons and 16 seasons of thinking (at least once), "can't I just pull last year's outlines? The facts didn't change. And they probably won't even notice."

And every Advent I am hit by the same remarkable truth: The Story is an old, old one that never changes. Yet, it gets sweeter, grander, more startling every single time we come to it. GOD took on flesh! Eternal Life was born to die. My Judge took my judgment. And the Gift that none of us deserve gave Himself freely for every person, of every nation, tribe & tongue, who will receive Him. There is no Story as phenomenal as this one. And, friend, it's true.

This Advent my prayer for us is that we discover anew that the Good News that brings great joy really is for all people, at all times, including us. Maybe this year you come to Advent with sorrow tinging your celebrations. Perhaps you've had more doubts than certainty about God's ability to keep His promises this past year. This might be a ho-hum season in your mind (after all, you've probably heard the Story even more times than I've preached it). Approaching the Story from any and all of those positions really does not matter.

It is Good News of great joy for all who come, regardless of how they come. Because this is the News that shouts "for God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son." Thanks for taking this Advent journey with me.
