Last summer at Musical Theater Camp, we explored the story of *Frozen*, but not just the surface-level version the kids performed on stage. We talked with them about what it means to have a "frozen heart" and how sin can harden and isolate us. Then we shared the Good News: through Christ's ultimate act of love and sacrifice, our frozen hearts can be made alive again. Watching that truth sink in throughout the week was incredibly powerful.

This year, we're stepping into the story of *Aladdin*, and we're focusing on the idea that we were created to reign with God. From the very beginning, God made us to reflect His goodness and to live as kings and queens in His kingdom. But like Aladdin, sin often causes us to forget who we are. We try to prove our worth, cover up our flaws, or grasp for control instead of trusting the One who made us.

Throughout the week, we'll walk with our campers through God's original design, the fall, and the hope we find in Jesus, the perfect King who traded His crown for a cross. Using simple props like crowns and mirrors, we'll help the kids see that their identity isn't something they have to earn. It's already been given to them by a loving King.

By the end of the week, we hope each camper can remember an eight-count and a few lines from the script, but more than that, we hope every camper leaves knowing they are deeply loved, fully known, and called to live as part of God's story. We would love your prayers for the week ahead, and we can't wait to share what God does through it.
