From the Desk of Pastor Kelly

I don't do New Year resolutions. I figure if I've been completely unsuccessful in motivating myself to 'improve' on April, June or December 1, January 1 probably won't be any different. And, besides, all of the dark chocolate I was gifted for Christmas will still be around by then, so I'm *definitely* not starting any new diet or exercise plan that early in the year. ©

So, no New Year resolutions. But I do, each year, take an End of Year evaluation.

At some point next week (I'm writing this on Dec. 23), a few days before 2026 officially begins, I'll go for a walk with Jesus and we'll talk about the last year. I'll ask Him to remind me of what He's done, how He's shown me His love and power in a new way, where He is bringing light into my darkness. We'll talk about how He's working in the lives of the people I love.

And then I'll ask Him the Big Question: 'Do I look more like You at the end of 2025 than I did at the beginning? Am I less short-tempered and more long-sufferingly patient? Do I worry (even a little bit) less and trust you (even a mustard-seed worth) more? Are my lips increasingly honoring You? Is my life reflecting Your authority & lordship in new areas?'

That one is a little scary. But, wow, is it ever important. Because looking more like Jesus is how we give Him Glory.

Thousands of years ago, our Father God made a promise to Moses and His chosen people. He said to them, 'See, I make a covenant. Before all your people I will do marvels such as have not been done in all the earth, nor in any nation; and all the people whom you are among shall see the work of the LORD. For it is an awesome thing that I will do with you' (Exodus 34:10).

Do you see what He promises? Our Father says that *He* will change us – He, through His goodness and mercy, His love and power, will accomplish marvelous works in us that other people around us can see! That means He'll make us look more like Jesus. And I believe it's His glorious intention to deepen our reflection of Jesus each year we have breath, so that we look more like His Son on December 31, 2025 than we did on January 1, 2025.

That's why I take an End of Year evaluation. I want Him to show me where He's growing me up in Him and where I need to allow Him to do so next year.

This New Year skip the resolutions. You can't make yourself 'better' anyhow. Instead, go for a walk with Jesus, let Him tell you how He's making you new and ask *Him* to make you look more like Him this year. Then do the things He's asking you to do or to be, as you draw closer to Him.
