From the Desk of Pastor Kelly

I am keenly aware of every muscle in my legs and back today. Every. Single. One. Over the weekend, with the help of amazing friends (who, thankfully, get paid in pizza & burritos), I re-landscaped a very large, rather steep flower bed that runs nearly the length of my property.

To be honest, it's a project I've been putting off. The bed looked terrible. That's no exaggeration – a giant pine tree that looked half dead because I'd had to trim it so many times to keep it out of the sidewalk, large rocks that the neighbor kids had repeatedly jumped on and left literally littering the sidewalk, and stones that had slid down the embankment revealing ugly, hard-packed dirt underneath. We won't even mention the hodge-podge of plants & field of weeds.

I knew it needed TLC. Every time I drove past, which is at least twice daily, I was confronted with the ugliness. But, you know how it goes. The thought of doing the work was paralyzing. It would take hours of sweat and mind-numbingly tedious work to renovate. So I ignored it.

Until a friend said, "we both know you hate the condition it's in. Why don't you let me help?" Somehow, those simple words made it possible to confront what I just couldn't imagine dealing with on my own. Both because they confirmed that the yard really did look awful and they meant I didn't have to do it alone.

I wonder what the equivalent is in your life? Not a flowerbed, but in your internal world? Maybe it's a relationship that's long been neglected and you don't even know where to begin to repair the damage of neglect. Perhaps it's that sin pattern that God keeps confronting you with and to which you've made the spiritual equivalent of turning a blind eye, because the thought of facing that head-on is overwhelming.

Don't get me wrong, choosing to say 'yes' to allowing the Holy Spirit to renovate your heart and life will likely leave you feeling every 'muscle' in your body. Every. Single. One. He believes in true overhaul. We want to throw down some mulch and He says we're ripping the whole thing out, because He wants to put in something new, something beautiful.

But it's worth it. The work of trusting Jesus to heal and bring change to that area you've long been ignoring is worth it, because that is how we come to know His power and love, to see His ability to take 'mess' and make it beautiful in His hands. And He never asks us to do it alone. That's why He calls us into community, so brothers & sisters can walk with us in the slow, wonderful journey of resting in and responding to His love.
